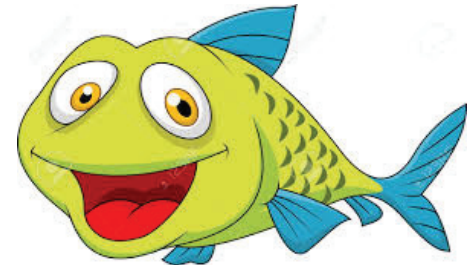

Mexican Baked Fish



Ingredients

1-1/2 pounds Calico Bass
1 cup salsa Herdez Salsa Casera, Mild (or whatever)
1 cup shredded sharp Cheddar cheese
1/2 cup coarsely crushed Fritos Corn Chips
1 avocado - peeled, pitted and sliced
1/4 cup sour cream
Pats of Butter

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C). Add a few pats of Butter to the bottom of the pan, rub the pan and leave the butter.

Rinse fish fillets under cold water, and pat dry with paper towels. Lay fillets side by side in the prepared baking dish.

Pour the salsa over the top, and sprinkle evenly with the shredded cheese.

Top with the crushed corn chips. Bake, uncovered, in the preheated oven for 15 minutes, or until fish is opaque and flakes with a fork.

Serve topped with sliced avocado and sour cream.

Her favorite Rods and Reels are made by Shimano. She believes that Shimano is far superior than the rest.

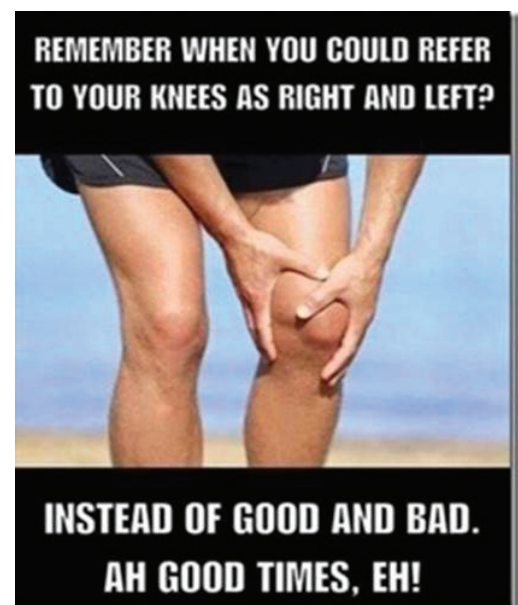
Her favorite bait to fish with is live squid.

STAY SAFE

With the Holidays just around the corner, YES you heard right ... the Holidays, we want all you ladies to stay safe!



Remember STAY OFF THE PHONE when walking to your car to and from shopping. During this time you are distracted and become an easy target for a purse grabber!

If someone asks you for the time, be sure to keep them at a distance.

Jackpot



Most of you seasoned anglers know what the Jackpot is. Before any fishing starts you are asked if you want to be in the jackpot. The cost of the jackpot can vary from \$5 to \$20 (depending on the length of the trip). The money is put into a pot and at the end of the trip or when the Captain announces "Jackpot" you go to the stern to compete in the jackpot. Even if you have seen bigger fish brought on the boat it's a good idea to watch the jackpot. The fish that you thought was bigger than yours might not be in the jackpot. Sometimes different species of fish may appear smaller but weigh more.... if you have any questions ask one of the crew. When you get your jackpot money, it may not be the amount you think it should be because not everyone has put into it and sometimes the crew retains a percentage for handling. I have heard some anglers boast "There's 60 anglers on this boat, that's \$300" and when they get their \$180 they think they have been ripped off by the crew... or somethings not right. It's a good idea to go with the thought that the whole ordeal only cost you \$5 to begin with.

To o leave or take the jackpot? Some anglers feel it is bad luck to take the jackpot off the boat thus they leave the entire pot for the crew. Others leave half, some pay their galley bill and leave therest, so ask for a re-ride pass, some ask for a t-shirt. I think that it depends on your financial situation. If you need the money, take it and leave them a gracious tip. If you love fishing and know you want to come back on the boat, ask for a pass. If you want to revel in the glory and remember the day ask them to sign a 5 dollar bill, put the date, name of boat and the description of the fish... put it in your scrapbook with your photo or keep it in your tackle box for good luck. Enjoy your victory and be proud you are a Dana Wharf Lady Angler!



Tipping... How Much?

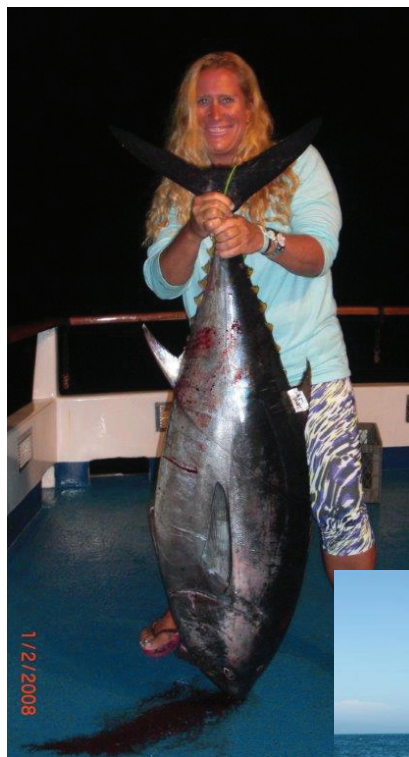
If you receive good service show the crew your appreciation in a big fat tip! When you go out to dinner it is customary to leave a tip if you receive good service.

Many of us leave a tip out of habit if we get bad or poor service. Crew wages are not that grand and if you breakdown the hours they get for their wages it's below minimum wage! Most crew members work hard, they count on giving you great service in trade for the reward. Most give up land jobs for their love of the water. I know when I worked as a cook I would have to tell myself between meals to look out the window and bask in the beauty of my view of the ocean, not to many land jobs have this beauty! When you watch what the crew does you can tell it is very hard work. If the service was good they deserve every dollar you give them. According to United Anglers, Salt Water Women - a normal tip would be 20% of the cost of your trip or \$3-\$5 a day per crew member. If fees are collected separately for galley and fish filleting, be sure to split the tip between the two.

Okay, enough about tipping. I see a lot of you girls standing around waiting for a deckhand to remove your fish and put it in the bag... let's try and make their job easier and take care of ourselves. If you do it yourself you won't have to wait and you can get your bait back in the water quickly.

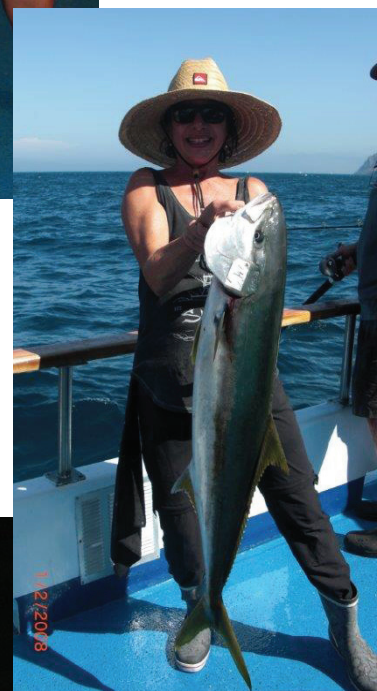
