Tipping On Our Charters

Recently I've been asked by the newer members, about tipping. There is no set guideline and the amount of tipping is a personal and individual preference as is the handling of a jackpot if you are fortunate to win it. But just as an aid/guideline, I talked with Darlen Lee (who previously owned and operated a Sportfishing boat) and Sheri Hockmeyer-Shaw (who works and handles charters in the Dana Wharf Sportfishing office), I combined their input and this is what they gave as

suggested guidelines: $\frac{3}{4}$ day charters \$20.00, over night charters \$35.00, this is a base amount and additional amounts should be based on the following: how helpful is/was the boat crew (assistance loading your tackle and equipment on the boat, setting up equipment and tackle, handling of your catch, etc.), the special attention given to the ladies on our charters, and that we are a fishing club sponsored by the Dana Wharf Landing. Remember, the crew depends upon tips as part of their livelihood. But as I mentioned, tipping and sharing jackpot winnings, is a personal and individual choice.

Pinky's Note:

I would kinda like to add my 2 cents or Jackpot! I won the first day jackpot on the tuna trip and was asked by the second day winner, who was on their first tuna trip what they should do. My take of the situation is, I budgeted and came with the intention of tipping \$100 which was a little under 20% of the cost of my trip, providing I received good service, which I did. I didn't go with the thought that I would walk away with the jackpot money so to me it's unbudgeted found money ... nothing out of my pocket except the \$20 I put in to participate which I budgeted for. I asked the second day winner did you come with the intention of tipping, she said YES, do you need that jackpot money? She said NO. Could you afford to leave it for the crew? She said, Yes. So she left the jackpot too and a generous tip. It all depends on what the winner can personally afford and they should not be judged by what they can or can't afford. When I owned my boat we had special hats that said "JACKPOT" on the side that our crew gave away only if they received the entire jackpot... I had to order 144 hats for the season. Anglers love to brag! Having that hat opened up so much camaraderie amongst the anglers..." Hey, how'd you get that hat? How big was your fish? It just sets a happy tone for the trip.

In the summer between 6th and 7th grade, I nagged my uncle Ted to take me ocean fishing. He would go out on a trip every few weeks with his fishing buddies. I am sure the guys said "We're taking who with us"? It was an albacore trip out of old Davy's Locker, Newport. Ted would hook an albacore and hand it off to me. Ever since that first trip, I've been hooked on fishing. My uncle and I fished locally together for the next 30 years, everything from rockfish to tuna and everything in between. Because of his failing health our last trips were 1/2-day boats for sand bass. Our rolls were now reversed. I drove, rigged the tackle and filleted the catch. This was a beautiful time.

In 1980, I went on my first long range trip. It was a 10-day boat ride on the Q-105 to Alijos Rocks and the Ridge. On this trip I caught by first big YFT, Broomtail Grouper, Yellowtail and Wahoo! The tackle of the day was 4/0 and 6/0 Senator reels, 660 rods and a stand-up vest.

For the next 20 years, I did a 10-day trip in the Winter, a 16-18 day trip in the Spring, Albacore when they arrived in So. Cal. and rockcod when the weather was cold.

Today, I do a lot less fishing. The albacore have been absent since 2006. Long range trips now target big cow YFT (been there, done that) and not MY favorite, Wahoo! It's been fun being a member of the Dana Wharf Lady Anglers and the Inland Saltwater Anglers clubs. They keep me on the water fishing.

One last item, neither of my adult children were interested in ocean fishing. Life skipped a generation, my grandson, Dominick, is at this moment a member of the crew on the "Pacific Dawn", the hottest BFT boat in the San Diego fleet.

Know Your Species

Pacific Bluefin Tuna
(*Thunnus orientalis*)



The Pacific bluefin tuna is one of three bluefin species found worldwide, including the Atlantic bluefin tuna (*Thunnus thynnus*) and the Southern bluefin tuna (*Thunnus maccoyii*). They exhibit high metabolic rates, unique endothermic traits, and extraordinary cardiac performance, making them extremely fast and powerful swimmers able to tolerate both temperate and tropical waters.

Prized as a culinary commodity, Pacific bluefin is harvested by many nations and is considered one of the most valuable fish in the ocean. The SWFSC collaborates with many international scientific and management bodies to conduct research on the Pacific bluefin tuna stock, in efforts to manage the fishery and conserve the species.

Of the tunas, Pacific bluefin has the largest geographic range. It spawns in the Western Pacific between central Japan and the northern Philippines and in the Sea of Japan from April through August. While some bluefin spend their entire lives in the Western Pacific, some young fish migrate to the Eastern Pacific.

At about age one, a portion of the population migrate to the Eastern Pacific and start to arrive off the coast of Baja California, Mexico. They remain in the Eastern Pacific for a few years and then migrate back to the Western Pacific Ocean to spawn, a journey taking as little as fifty-five days. Larger adults are rarely found in U.S. waters, which stretches from 3-200 nautical miles offshore.

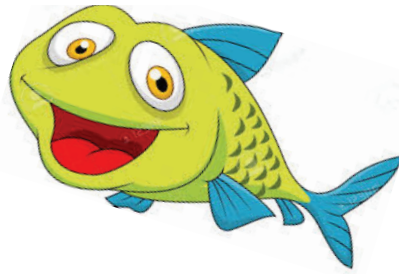

Do you still have green tomatoes left on the vines? Here's a great recipe to preserve them. This take sometime to make but oh man! what a treat! I got the recipe from an old timer at the Nuui Cunni Indian Center by my house, <http://www.nuuicunni.com>

GEORGE'S GREEN TOMATO PICKLES

Yields 8 pints

2 Gallons sliced Green Tomatoes (use firm tomatoes that have not started to turn pink)
1/2 Cup Salt
1 tbsp. Alum Powder
6 Cups Vinegar (5% Acidity)
2 Cups Water
8 Cups Sugar
2 Tbsp Mixed Pickling Spice (found in latin section of store)
1 tsp Cinnamon
2 Tbsp Celery Seed
1 Tsp All Spice
2 Tbsp Mustard Seed

Day 1 - Sprinkle Salt over tomatoes and allow to stand overnight

Day 2 - in the morning bring 4 quarts water to boil with Alum. Drain and discard liquid from tomatoes. Pour boiling Alum water over tomatoes and let stand 20 min. Combine spices and tie loosely in a cheesecloth bag. Combine vinegar, water, sugar and spices and bring to a boil. Drain Alum water off tomatoes rinse tomatoes with cold water and drain. Then pour boiling vinegar solution over tomatoes and let stand overnight.

Day 3 - Drain vinegar solution from tomatoes into a pot, reheat solution to boiling, then pour solution back over tomatoes and let stand overnight.

Day 4 - Wash and sterilize jars. Bring pickles and solution to a boil. Pack jars within 1/2 inch of the top and process in boiling water bath 5 minutes.



I brought some on the Tuna trip and Shirl B. loved them... she's making a batch...maybe she'll share :)

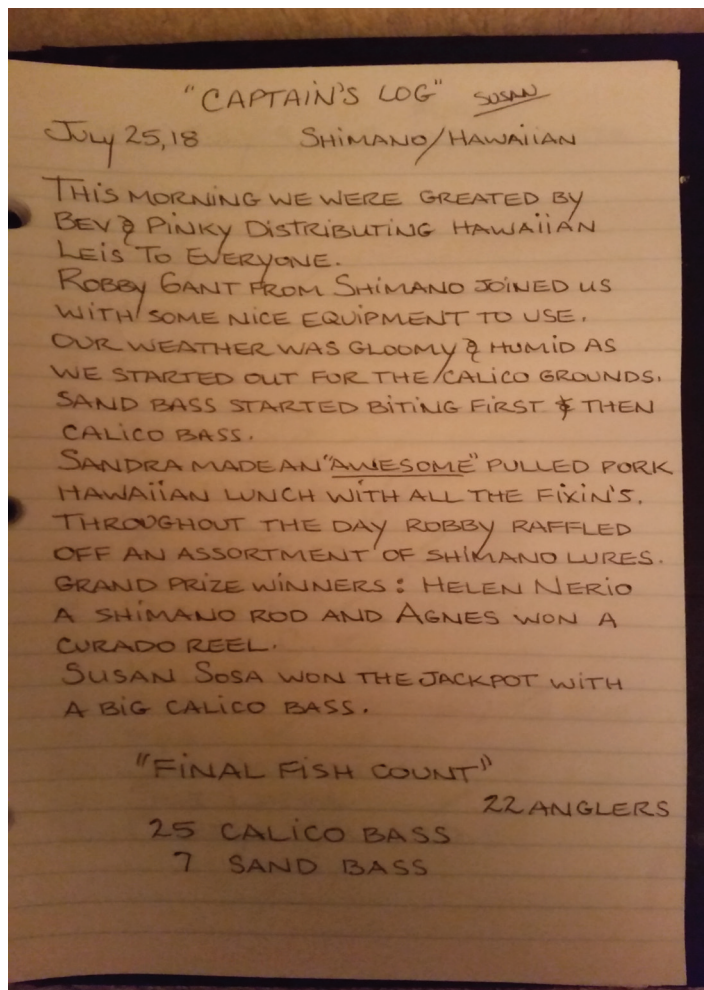

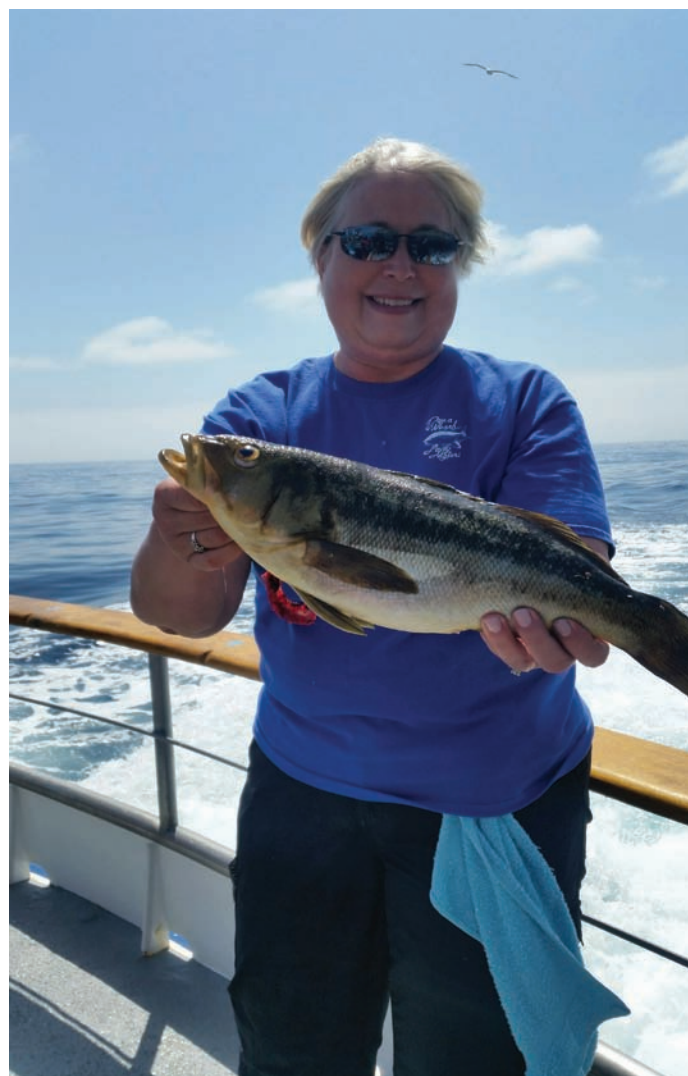
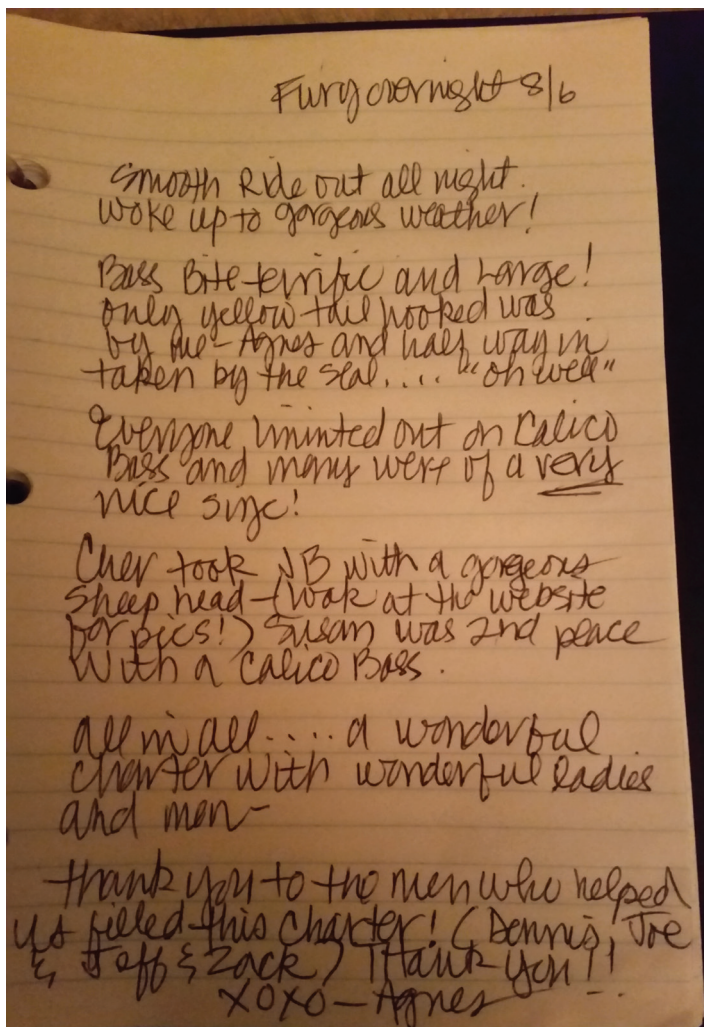
